### **The Community**

Cedaredge is located in Delta County, Colorado. According to the 2010 census, the population of Cedaredge was 2,253. Cedaredge is nestled in the Surface Creek Valley beneath the Southern slopes of the Grand Mesa, the largest mesa in the world. Our elevated perspective allows for spectacular view of the San Juan Mountains, the Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park, and the nearby communities of Delta, Olathe, and Montrose. Cedaredge is a small agricultural community, which focuses on producing apples, peaches, and wine in several area vineyards. Attractions include the Deer Creek Village Golf Club, Historic Pioneer Town, and several art galleries. Sporting opportunities include camping, trophy hunting, hiking, and Gold Medal fishing at more than 250 lakes atop the Grand Mesa. During the winter many local residents go snowmobiling and Nordic skiing on some of the myriad trails atop the Grand Mesa. Powderhorn Ski Resort is located 30 miles north of Cedaredge.

### **Educational Experience**

Cedaredge High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling approximately 250 students in grades 9<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup>. Cedaredge High School offers a rigorous academic program closely aligned to Colorado State Educational Standards. We have a staff of 12 full-time teachers and 4 part-time teachers who teach a variety of classes including technology, drama, Spanish, art, band, choir and agricultural studies. The Math, Science, History, and English departments offer high-school as well as some college-level courses and AP courses such as English Composition, Literature, Algebra, Pre-Calculus, Biology, American History, Environmental Science, Computer Science and Journalism. In addition, our students have the opportunity to attend the Delta-Montrose Technical College located in the neighboring town of Delta for classes in nursing, mechanics, cosmetology and drafting.
